**Baptism – Infant:** Baptisms are only scheduled on specific weekends throughout the year at liturgies. Please check inside this bulletin for upcoming Baptism dates. A required initial parent preparation session occurs several weeks before the Baptism. To register for the next parent session and schedule your child's Baptism, please call the Parish Office. An additional required session is also held just prior to the Baptism.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office. Minimum of six months preparation time.

**Anointing/Hospital Visit:** If you or someone you know is being admitted to Chesapeake General Hospital, please call the office so we may share Eucharist with them and/or celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.

**Confirmation (Youth)** may celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation when they are in the tenth grade and are at least 15 years of age. In addition to the Confirmation program, each confirmandi must also be enrolled in a religious education program. Confirmation is normally celebrated during the Easter Season. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for additional information.

**Confirmation (Adult):** Baptized Adults who have received their first Eucharist and wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation participate in an eight-week process usually beginning in Lent. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

**Adults for Baptism or Reception into the Catholic Church:** Adults who have not been baptized or wish to be received into the Catholic Church participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). **Children:** The process is adapted for children 7 years of age or older. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

**Holy Orders, Religious Life and Lay Ministry:** Men and women who are considering Holy Orders, Religious Life, or Lay Ministry are encouraged to call Fr. Jazmin at the Parish Office for information.

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**2018 ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL:** It is important for all our parishioners to complete their pledges. The assistance that is provided to the ministries and programs the Appeal supports, such as grants to our mission parishes, heating and grocery assistance to families, health insurance for our retired priests and tuition for our future priests to attend the seminary, is based on what is collected. In addition, all parishes receive back a portion of their amounts collected. This means the more we collect, the more we can address our important parish needs. This year, the funds returned to us will be used to purchase an Electric Sign to be installed next to Cedar Road to communicate our Mass schedule and parish events. To date, we have raised **\$75,167.00** on a target of **\$31,980.00**, putting us at **235.04 %** of our target. 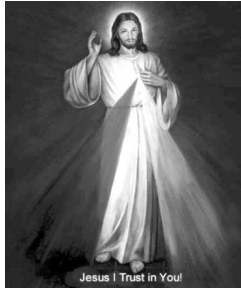

**SILENCE...A DISCIPLINE TO MASTER**

There is a recent study that indicates the average person spends 32.1 hours each week listening to music. Imagine that for just a moment. If most people have 16 waking hours in a day (8 hours asleep), this means we spend two whole days each week listening to music. And, my guess is, the music most people listen to is not Gregorian chant! Even realizing that most of us can accomplish other tasks while listening to music, it does cause one to pause at the amount of time our heads are filled with musical sound (not to mention other sources of noise from television, radio, and the Internet). Is this perhaps too much noise and not enough silence?

As Christians in today's noise-filled world, spending quality time with the Lord in silence is a valuable discipline, and one that must be practiced and mastered. Requiring continual background noise in your life should raise a red flag that silence has become an uncomfortable state.

**We are Catholic.** Daily prayer in quiet solitude is an efficacious way to communicate with the Lord. Taking moments of quiet pause throughout the day to hear the voice of God is a discipline of profound value. After all, mastering silence will please your Master!
