**Baptism – Infant:** Baptisms are only scheduled on specific weekends throughout the year at liturgies. Please check inside this bulletin for upcoming Baptism dates. A required initial parent preparation session occurs several weeks before the Baptism. To register for the next parent session and schedule your child's Baptism, please call the Parish Office. An additional required session is also held just prior to the Baptism.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office. Minimum of six months preparation time.

**Anointing/Hospital Visit:** If you or someone you know is being admitted to Chesapeake General Hospital, please call the office so we may share Eucharist with them and/or celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.

**Confirmation (Youth)** may celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation when they are in the tenth grade and are at least 15 years of age. In addition to the Confirmation program, each confirmandi must also be enrolled in a religious education program. Confirmation is normally celebrated during the Easter Season. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for additional information.

**Confirmation (Adult):** Baptized Adults who have received their first Eucharist and wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation participate in an eight-week process usually beginning in Lent. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

**Adults for Baptism or Reception into the Catholic Church:** Adults who have not been baptized or wish to be received into the Catholic Church participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). **Children:** The process is adapted for children 7 years of age or older. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

**Holy Orders, Religious Life and Lay Ministry:** Men and women who are considering Holy Orders, Religious Life, or Lay Ministry are encouraged to call Fr. Jazmin at the Parish Office for information.

## **MORE THAN STORIES OF JESUS**

Many Christians attend church services on Sundays. Often the sermons from pastors and ministers leading these services naturally center around Jesus. All Christians, and especially those who lead Sunday services, are called to pass on the stories of Jesus. After all, the goal of Christian ministers is to bring their congregations to believe in and follow Jesus. Reading Scripture and talking about Jesus forms the basis of a typical Sunday sermon.

As a Catholic Christian, however, we do more than attend a Sunday service and hear stories about Jesus. We assist the priest at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The priest, in persona Christi, is re-presenting the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of our Lord. Jesus Christ is actually the Priest and Victim at every Holy Mass. Through the ordained hands of the priest, each worthy Catholic is intimately united to Jesus when receiving the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

**We are Catholic.** Unlike other Christian faiths, the priest does not just bring stories of Jesus at Holy Mass. The priest actually brings Jesus, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity to us. As Catholics, we, too, listen to stories about Jesus but we also experience the Divine Intimacy that only takes place at a Catholic Mass.
