Baptism – Infant: Baptisms are only scheduled on specific weekends throughout the year at liturgies. Please check inside this bulletin for upcoming Baptism dates. A required initial parent preparation session occurs several weeks before the Baptism. To register for the next parent session and schedule your child's Baptism, please call the Parish Office. An additional required session is also held just prior to the Baptism.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office. Minimum of six months preparation time.

Anointing/Hospital Visit: If you or someone you know is being admitted to Chesapeake General Hospital, please call the office so we may share Eucharist with them and/or celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.

Confirmation (Youth) may celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation when they are in the tenth grade and are at least 15 years of age. In addition to the Confirmation program, each confirmandi must also be enrolled in a religious education program. Confirmation is normally celebrated during the Easter Season. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for additional information.

Confirmation (Adult): Baptized Adults who have received their first Eucharist and wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation participate in an eight-week process usually beginning in Lent. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

Adults for Baptism or Reception into the Catholic Church: Adults who have not been baptized or wish to be received into the Catholic Church participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). **Children:** The process is adapted for children 7 years of age or older. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

Holy Orders, Religious Life and Lay Ministry: Men and women who are considering Holy Orders, Religious Life, or Lay Ministry are encouraged to call Fr. Jazmin at the Parish Office for information.

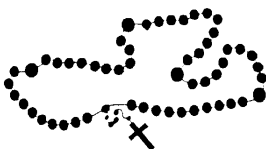

Take a little time to ponder. This moment can be a source of discussion in your family, your Bible Study group, or Religious Education class

JUST BECAUSE YOU CAN, DOESN'T MEAN YOU SHOULD

We've all had the opportunity to experience all-you-can-eat buffet restaurants. Many people enjoy this type of dining because of the variety of food choices that are offered, the convenience of not having to wait for food to be prepared, and the pleasure of selecting food by its appearance. For some, this is a preferred restaurant option.

Another reason for dining in this type of establishment is because there are no limits on how much food that can be consumed. Often this may lead to overindulgence, eating much more than one should and eating unhealthy foods that one may normally avoid. Having the opportunity to eat as much as you want doesn't mean that you should eat as much as you can. In fact, overindulgence can have a devastating effect on your physical health.

As Christians living in a secular society, we are also afforded many opportunities to participate in the worldly buffet, allowing us to do things that we shouldn't be doing and engaging in activities that are harmful to our souls. Just like an all-you-can-eat buffet, indulging in unhealthy options for your soul can lead to spiritual sickness. Overconsumption of sinful acts such as pornography, gossip, and promiscuity to name a few can take a toll on your spiritual health and may require immediate attention from the ultimate healer of the soul, Jesus Christ.

We are Catholic. Our spiritual health is more important than our physical health, as our spiritual health has an eternal consequence. If you find yourself choosing from the worldly buffet of sin, turn to the Lord for help. Consume yourself totally with Christ when entering the worldly buffet and enjoy a life of eternal spiritual health.

Reflect: Sacred Scripture: 1 John 2:15-17

Pray: *Heavenly Father, help me to avoid overconsumption in this world and turn away from my sinful choices.*
