Baptism – Infant: Baptisms are only scheduled on specific weekends throughout the year at liturgies. Please check inside this bulletin for upcoming Baptism dates. A required initial parent preparation session occurs several weeks before the Baptism. To register for the next parent session and schedule your child's Baptism, please call the Parish Office. An additional required session is also held just prior to the Baptism.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office. Minimum of six months preparation time.

- **Anointing/Hospital Visit:** If you or someone you know is being admitted to Chesapeake General Hospital, please call the office so we may share Eucharist with them and/or celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.
- **Confirmation (Youth)** may celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation when they are in the tenth grade and are at least 15 years of age. In addition to the Confirmation program, each confirmandi must also be enrolled in a religious education program. Confirmation is normally celebrated during the Easter Season. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for additional information.
- **Confirmation (Adult):** Baptized Adults who have received their first Eucharist and wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation participate in an eightweek process usually beginning in Lent. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.
- Adults for Baptism or Reception into the Catholic Church: Adults who have not been baptized or wish to be received into the Catholic Church participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). **Children:** The process is adapted for children 7 years of age or older. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.
- **Holy Orders, Religious Life and Lay Ministry:** Men and women who are considering Holy Orders, Religious Life, or Lay Ministry are encouraged to call Fr. Jazmin at the Parish Office for information.

TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

If you are not currently registered, there are two options. Registrations are held after every liturgy at the New Parishoner Desk. Throughout the year, there will be exceptions, such as Easter. Please check the calendar of events in the bulletin. The second option is to register in the Parish Office during office hours.



Take a little time to ponder. This moment can be a source of discussion in your family, your Bible Study group, or Religious Education class.

APPLY OXYGEN TO YOURSELF FIRST

Whenever traveling by air, one of the first tasks of the flight attendants is to cover the safety features of the aircraft. Always emphasized is the importance of applying oxygen to yourself before helping others, in the event the aircraft loses cabin pressure. In other words, take care of yourself first, so that you are able to help others. After all, you will be no good to others, if you yourself are incapacitated.

The same concept can be applied to sharing our Catholic faith. Have you learned and applied the teachings of the Church in your own life so you are prepared to share the faith with others? Or are you incapacitated when challenged with the various elements of Catholic teachings? Are your prepared to answer cultural issues of our time, including the Church's position on abortion, cohabitation, and gay "marriage"? Or are you silent when questioned?

We are Catholic. We live in a time of cultural confusion. In order to be a witness of the Gospel of Christ, we must know the teachings of the Church, live according to the teachings of the Church, and be prepared to share these teaching with others. Just like on an aircraft with a loss of cabin pressure, we must first take care of ourselves so we are in a position to help others.

Reflect: Acts 3:6

Pray: Heavenly Father, help me to know and love you more and more each day by growing in my knowledge of the faith.




PRINCE OF PEACE LUMEN CHRISTI SOCIETY CHAPTER
