Baptism – Infant: Baptisms are only scheduled on specific weekends throughout the year at liturgies. Please check inside this bulletin for upcoming Baptism dates. A required initial parent preparation session occurs several weeks before the Baptism. To register for the next parent session and schedule your child's Baptism, please call the Parish Office. An additional required session is also held just prior to the Baptism.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office. Minimum of six months preparation time.

Anointing/Hospital Visit: If you or someone you know is being admitted to Chesapeake General Hospital, please call the office so we may share Eucharist with them and/or celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.

Confirmation (Youth) may celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation when they are in the tenth grade and are at least 15 years of age. In addition to the Confirmation program, each confirmandi must also be enrolled in a religious education program. Confirmation is normally celebrated during the Easter Season. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for additional information.

Confirmation (Adult): Baptized Adults who have received their first Eucharist and wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation participate in an eight-week process usually beginning in Lent. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

Adults for Baptism or Reception into the Catholic Church: Adults who have not been baptized or wish to be received into the Catholic Church participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). **Children:** The process is adapted for children 7 years of age or older. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

Holy Orders, Religious Life and Lay Ministry: Men and women who are considering Holy Orders, Religious Life, or Lay Ministry are encouraged to call Fr. Jazmin at the Parish Office for information.

Ponderful Moment

Take a little time to ponder. This moment can be a source of discussion in your family, your Bible Study group, or Religious Education class

MASS EXPECTATIONS

While dining out, we have all had the experience of receiving unclean silverware. And, no doubt, we have all received food that did not meet our expectations and had to be sent back to the kitchen. Possibly a mere hair in our food was cause for rejection. We have standards. When our expectations are not met, we typically take action and seek remediation.

When attending holy Mass, are there expectations the Lord has of each one of us? Our Church teaches that we must not receive the Body and Blood of Jesus unworthily. Have we given much thought to our past sins, our past grave sins? Have we examined our consciences in light of grave sins committed years or maybe even decades ago?

Often, when we examine our consciences, we only think about the sins since our last Confession. Consider reexamining your conscience in light of your entire life. It's easy to justify not going back in time looking for your past grave sins, including a possible lapse in Sunday Mass attendance. Ask the Holy Spirit to enlighten your conscience for past grave sins that need to be confessed. Then be prepared. Your prayer will be answered.

We are Catholic. We are required to be a holy tabernacle for the Lord with each and every reception of His Body and Blood. Pray to the Holy Spirit to become a spotless temple for Jesus by examining your conscience daily for all of your sins and, in a special way for grave sins of the past. We never want to disappoint the Lord. Receiving Jesus worthily is a Mass expectation that will never disappoint.

Ponder: What keeps us from frequenting the Sacrament of Reconciliation?

Reflect: 1 Cor 11:27-32

Pray: Heavenly Father, give me the courage to examine my conscience thoroughly and receive the grace and pardon through the Sacrament of Reconciliation so as to become a pure tabernacle for you in the Eucharist.

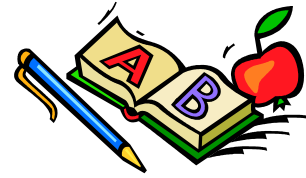

The FSA will attend committal ceremonies when needed, and will set up the memorial design process, serving as the point of contact with families.

Qualifications: Associate's degree in a related field is preferred, and at least 3 years of relevant cemetery experience. Strong working knowledge of Microsoft Office. Must be compassionate, caring and confidential. Required skills include planning and organization, time management and attention to detail. The candidate must be able to adapt to changing priorities. The ability to maintain adequate records and keep such records current is essential. A good working knowledge of Catholic Church teaching and structure is required. Must have a valid state issued driver's license, good driving record and proof of insurance.
