Baptism – Infant: Baptisms are only scheduled on specific weekends throughout the year at liturgies. Please check inside this bulletin for upcoming Baptism dates. A required initial parent preparation session occurs several weeks before the Baptism. To register for the next parent session and schedule your child's Baptism, please call the Parish Office. An additional required session is also held just prior to the Baptism.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office. Minimum of six months preparation time.

Anointing/Hospital Visit: If you or someone you know is being admitted to Chesapeake General Hospital, please call the office so we may share Eucharist with them and/or celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.

Confirmation (Youth) may celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation when they are in the tenth grade and are at least 15 years of age. In addition to the Confirmation program, each confirmandi must also be enrolled in a religious education program. Confirmation is normally celebrated during the Easter Season. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for additional information.

Confirmation (Adult): Baptized Adults who have received their first Eucharist and wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation participate in an eight-week process usually beginning in Lent. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

Adults for Baptism or Reception into the Catholic Church: Adults who have not been baptized or wish to be received into the Catholic Church participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). **Children:** The process is adapted for children 7 years of age or older. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

Holy Orders, Religious Life and Lay Ministry: Men and women who are considering Holy Orders, Religious Life, or Lay Ministry are encouraged to call Fr. Jazmin at the Parish Office for information.

SECOND COLLECTION NEXT WEEKEND: Next weekend our parish will take up the Collection for the Archdiocese for the Military Services, USA (AMS). Established by Saint John Paul II in 1985, the AMS is the only U.S. diocese responsible for providing pastoral care to men and women serving in the U.S. Armed Forces, enrolled at a U.S. Military Academy, being treated as a patient at any of the 153 U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Centers, or working for the federal government beyond U.S. borders – including those from our own parish and diocese. Including families, AMS priests and deacons serve approximately 1.8 million Catholics who hail from 50 states and U.S. territories. While the salaries and retirement of Catholic military chaplains are paid for by the U.S. Government, the AMS does not receive any funding from the government or military for program and administrative costs. Being Faithful Catholics and Citizens in our Commonwealth

September 2019

Election Day is November 5. Voters will elect members to all 140 seats in the Virginia General Assembly – 40 in the Senate and 100 in the House of Delegates. To be good Catholics and good Virginians, we must – with consciences well formed through prayer and the Church’s teachings – participate in these important decisions. As you prepare to vote, we offer these thoughts on weighing vital issues at stake, drawing from *Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, a statement of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (www.faithfulcitizenship.org) which describes how we make good moral choices as we respond to our baptismal call to promote the common good.

Many issues are important. “Every human being has a right to life, the fundamental right that makes all other rights possible, and a right to access to those things required for human decency – food and shelter, education and employment, health care and housing, freedom of religion and family life” (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 49). We must be attentive and engaged whenever human dignity is at stake for any of our brothers and sisters in the human family – whether they are born or unborn, rich or poor, a newcomer or of U.S. origin. This attentiveness and engagement includes addressing the frequency and severity of gun violence in Virginia and across the country.

Not all issues have equal moral weight. Some actions, such as abortion and euthanasia, are “intrinsically evil” – that is, “always incompatible with love of God and neighbor” (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 22). “[T]he moral obligation to oppose policies promoting intrinsically evil acts has a special claim on our consciences and our actions” (no. 37).

Protecting life is paramount. The right to life is “the fundamental right that makes all other rights possible” (*Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship*, no. 49). Our priority must be to protect life to the fullest extent possible.

Please vote on November 5 with a well formed conscience as a faithful Catholic and as a citizen of our Commonwealth.
