Baptism – Infant: Baptisms are only scheduled on specific weekends throughout the year at liturgies. Please check inside this bulletin for upcoming Baptism dates. A required initial parent preparation session occurs several weeks before the Baptism. To register for the next parent session and schedule your child's Baptism, please call the Parish Office. An additional required session is also held just prior to the Baptism.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office. Minimum of six months preparation time.

Anointing/Hospital Visit: If you or someone you know is being admitted to Chesapeake General Hospital, please call the office so we may share Eucharist with them and/or celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.

Confirmation (Youth) may celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation when they are in the tenth grade and are at least 15 years of age. In addition to the Confirmation program, each confirmandi must also be enrolled in a religious education program. Confirmation is normally celebrated during the Easter Season. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for additional information.

Confirmation (Adult): Baptized Adults who have received their first Eucharist and wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation participate in an eight-week process usually beginning in Lent. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

Adults for Baptism or Reception into the Catholic Church: Adults who have not been baptized or wish to be received into the Catholic Church participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). Children: The process is adapted for children 7 years of age or older. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

Holy Orders, Religious Life and Lay Ministry: Men and women who are considering Holy Orders, Religious Life, or Lay Ministry are encouraged to call Fr. Jazmin at the Parish Office for information.



WHO IS IT?

CAST is a Chesapeake organization led by Sam Howard of Great Bridge Presbyterian Church and is supported by Chesapeake area churches.

WHAT IS IT?

A confederation of area churches, synagogues, and other organizations that provide food, shelter and safety for the homeless in Chesapeake every winter.

WHERE IS IT?

CAST embraces the needs of the homeless in Chesapeake where there exists a significant homeless population. The organizations supporting this ministry are located both in Norfolk and Chesapeake. CAST supports one sponsor site each week starting with dinner on every Wednesday (late November through March) and concluding after breakfast the following Wednesday. CAST uses a bus to support Chesapeake homeless people – including families with children.

ITINERARY

Day 1, March 4, Wednesday, Departure from USA

Depart from USA with an overnight flight to Amman, Jordan.

Day 2, March 5, Thursday, Arrival to Amman, Jordan

On arrival to Jordan, we will be met by our tour guide and transferred to our hotel near the Dead Sea for dinner and overnight.

Day 3, March 6, Friday, Madaba, Mt. Nebo

After breakfast, we will drive to Mt. Nebo to view the "Promised Land" and the Dead Sea. Drive to Amman to join the city tour of Amman. Return to Dead Sea Resort for dinner and overnight.

Day 4, March 7, Saturday, Friday, Petra

After an early breakfast, we will drive through the desert terrain, to **Petra**: "The **Red Rose City** - Half as Old as Time." We will walk or go by horseback through the narrow canyon that leads to the **Red Rock**. There we will see scores of imposing monuments, including the **Khazneh** (treasury), the **Roman theatre** and many other ancient buildings, all carved into the pink mountains. During the walk-through Petra you will have a break for lunch in a nearby hotel, giving you a chance to relax a bit before we continue our journey. Return to Dead Sea Resort for dinner and overnight.

Day 5, March 8, Sunday, Jordan to Holy Land, Mt. Tabor, Nazareth

After breakfast, we will drive to border to cross to Holy Land through Allenby Bridge. Visit Mount Tabor with a spectacular view of upper Galilee, where Jesus transfigured in the presence of Peter, James and John. Celebrate mass at the Church of Transfiguration. Dinner and overnight in Nazareth.

Day 6, March 9, Monday, Mt. Tabor, Nazareth and Cana, Mt. Carmel

After breakfast, continue to Nazareth, visit the Basilica of the Annunciation and view the Blessed Cave, where Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary. View Mary and Joseph's House and carpentry shop where Jesus spent 30 years of his life. Visit Cana where Jesus performed his first miracle. Here married couples can renew their marriage vows. Continue to Haifa to visit Stella Maris Church, the Carmelite Monastery, Chapel of the Holy Family and Elijah's Cave. We will have a short stop to view the famous Bahai Gardens. Dinner and overnight in Nazareth.

Day 7, March 10, Tuesday, Sea of Galilee, Boat Ride, Capernaum, Tabgha, Jordan River

After breakfast, continue to the Mt. of Beatitudes. Here Jesus proclaimed his Sermon on the Mount. Drive to Capernaum, the town of Jesus which is the center of his ministry. Visit the House of St. Peter and the ruins of the ancient Synagogue where Jesus preached. Stop at Tabgha, the Primacy of St. Peter and visit the Church of the Miracle of the Loaves and Fishes, the site of the multiplication miracle. Boatride on the Lake of Galilee. Visit Jordan River where Jesus was baptized. Dinner and overnight in Nazareth.

Day 8, March 11, Wednesday, Galilee, Jerusalem, Bethlehem

After breakfast, continue to Bethlehem and visit Church of Nativity in Bethlehem where Jesus was born. Celebrate Mass here. Visit Milk Grotto and the Shepherd's Field. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 9, March 12, Thursday, Wednesday, Jerusalem

After breakfast, we will follow the Stations of the Cross along the Via Delarosa to the Holy Sepulcher and celebrate Mass here. See the Christian, Armenian Quarters and the Wailing Wall. Dinner and overnight in Jerusalem.

Day 10, March 13, Friday, Jerusalem, Ein Karem

After breakfast, we will drive to the Mt. of Olives, where we gain a panoramic view of The Old City of Jerusalem.
