Baptism – Infant: Baptisms are only scheduled on specific weekends throughout the year at liturgies. Please check inside this bulletin for upcoming Baptism dates. A required initial parent preparation session occurs several weeks before the Baptism. To register for the next parent session and schedule your child's Baptism, please call the Parish Office. An additional required session is also held just prior to the Baptism.

Marriage: Please call the Parish Office. Minimum of six months preparation time.

- **Anointing/Hospital Visit:** If you or someone you know is being admitted to Chesapeake General Hospital, please call the office so we may share Eucharist with them and/or celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.
- **Confirmation (Youth)** may celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation when they are in the tenth grade and are at least 15 years of age. In addition to the Confirmation program, each confirmandi must also be enrolled in a religious education program. Confirmation is normally celebrated during the Easter Season. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for additional information.
- **Confirmation (Adult):** Baptized Adults who have received their first Eucharist and wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation participate in an eightweek process usually beginning in Lent. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.
- Adults for Baptism or Reception into the Catholic Church: Adults who have not been baptized or wish to be received into the Catholic Church participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). **Children:** The process is adapted for children 7 years of age or older. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.
- **Holy Orders, Religious Life and Lay Ministry:** Men and women who are considering Holy Orders, Religious Life, or Lay Ministry are encouraged to call Fr. Jazmin at the Parish Office for information.

From their website: Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of baptism at Easter.



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

My Own Church Pull Your Own Year-End Giving Statement Update Your Personal Information

The software we now use for our parish database has the ability for individuals to create accounts, allowing you to update your personal data and also monitor your donations. You are even able to download an electronic copy of your year-end giving statements once they have been generated by the church.

How do you Access My Church?

- Input <u>https://richmond.parishsoftfamilysuite.com</u> into your browser (this cannot be done on mobile devices).
- Select "New User?"
- This will bring you to a registration form Fill out the form.
- **Church Staff** will have to approve the registration and then you will receive a temporary password. (We will check this several times a week; please be patient).
- Log back into "My Own Church" (see step 1 above).
- Your will be prompted for a permanent password.
- Log in (you may need to return to (<u>https://richmond.</u> <u>parishsoftfamilysuite.com</u>).
- Enter username and password.
- You now have access to your information and <u>only</u> your information.

My Offering Tab:

• Select Giving History – Here you can select a specific fund and/or year to look at. You can also download electronic yearend statements once they are available.

When: Monday, May 11-Friday, May 15. Option to arrive Sunday in order to start work early Monday morning.


What: Rebuilding damaged homes, primarily drywall, painting, flooring, carpentry, and perhaps roofing. Also, licensed electricians are urgently needed.

Annual Easter "Ham It Up Campaign "




