

The software we now use for our parish database has the ability for individuals to create accounts allowing you to update your personal data and also monitor your donations. You are even able to download an electronic copy of your year-end giving statement once they have been generated by the church.

#### **How do you Access My Church?**

- This will bring you to a registration form Fill out the form
- Church Staff will have to approve the registration and then you will receive a temporary password. (We will check this several times a week, please be patient)
- Log back into "My Own Church" (see step 1 above)
- · Your will be prompted for a permanent password
- Log in (you may need to return to (https://richmond. parishsoftfamilysuite.com)
- Enter username and password
- You now have access to your information and only your information

 Select Family Detail – here you can edit the file if you wish to make changes. Changes are not accepted until reviewed by POP staff.

#### My Offering Tab:

 Select Giving History – Here you can select a specific fund and/or year to look at. You can also download electronic year end statements once they are available.


