## Sacraments

**Baptism – Infant:** Baptism-Infant Baptisms currently take place outside of Mass throughout the year. Parents are required to attend a parent preparation session prior to their child's Baptism. Please check inside this bulletin for upcoming parent sessions. To register for the next parent session please contact Sister Dolores at the parish office or go to our parish website. Click on Sacrament tab and scroll down to Baptism.

**Marriage:** Please call the Parish Office. Minimum of six months preparation time.

**Anointing/Hospital Visit:** If you or someone you know is being admitted to Chesapeake General Hospital, please call the office so we may share Eucharist with them and/or celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick.

**Confirmation (Youth)** may celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation when they are in the tenth grade and are at least 15 years of age. In addition to the Confirmation program, each confirmandi must also be enrolled in a religious education program. Confirmation is normally celebrated during the Easter Season. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for additional information.

**Confirmation (Adult):** Baptized Adults who have received their first Eucharist and wish to celebrate the Sacrament of Confirmation participate in an eight-week process usually beginning in Lent. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

**Adults for Baptism or Reception into the Catholic Church:** Adults who have not been baptized or wish to be received into the Catholic Church participate in the Rite of Christian Initiation for Adults (RCIA). **Children:** The process is adapted for children 7 years of age or older. Contact Sister Dolores at the Parish Office for information.

**Holy Orders, Religious Life and Lay Ministry:** Men and women who are considering Holy Orders, Religious Life, or Lay Ministry are encouraged to call Fr. Jazmin at the Parish Office for information.

This important feast day on the octave of Easter emphasizes the connection between the “Easter Mystery of the Redemption” and our Lord’s limitless mercy. Please join us at Prince of Peace for a very special time of prayer at 2:30 p.m. on April 11, 2021. Our Divine Mercy prayer service will include Adoration of the Most Blessed Sacrament with Exposition and Benediction, praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and a blessing of the Divine Mercy portrait (which contains a second class relic of St. Faustina). **FOOD PANTRY:** Donations for the food pantry can be made on Monday from 10:00-11:00 a.m. and on Wednesday from 10:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. Someone is

near the pantry entrance to receive your donations. Financial gifts can be made by going to [popparish.org](http://popparish.org) and submitted through e-giving. You may not be present physically to give out the food but without your charity, we could not be your hands and heart. You are an integral part of this entire operation. We are doing a drive-through from 10:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. on Wednesday for anyone who needs food.

Thank you very much to all parishioners who donated food for the monthly collection. We do between 55 or 65 bags for the people who come to the drive-through on Wednesday morning so all the food we receive is really appreciated. Our next monthly collection will be April 10/11. At this time, we do not need canned vegetables. Medium size items are best to donate and NO GLASS jars. We can always use pasta and sauce (24 oz.), Soup (18 or 19 oz.), Jell-O, jelly, toilet paper, juice, cereal, canned fruit, Ramen noodles, boxed potatoes (6 oz.), tuna (5 oz.), pork & beans (15 oz.), Hamburger Helper (6 oz.), Mac & Cheese (7.25 oz.), and peanut butter (15 oz.). Everything is put into a paper bag so the large sizes are too heavy. God Bless. Let us give thanks that we are able to help those in need. **As a parishioner, if you need food, please come to the Food Pantry to pick up a bag of groceries, too.**

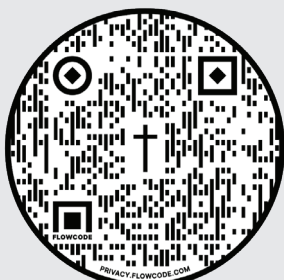

**ANNUAL APPEAL:**

Palm Sunday is never just “Palm Sunday.” It also always includes the Lord’s Passion. By juxtaposing both of these Gospel scenes in the same Mass, the Church is forcing us to consider a hard truth: we are a fickle people. Just as the people of Jerusalem praised Jesus, only to turn on Him a few days later, we too might claim Jesus as our Lord, but constantly turn from Him through our sins and self-centeredness. For many of us, we get a heavy dose of our weakness during Lent, when we begin with bold resolutions but so often come up short. But our shortcomings aren’t the focus of the readings today. Instead, the focus is on the steadfast love and constancy of Jesus Christ. Jesus knows we are fickle. Just like He knew that by coming into Jerusalem, despite the people’s praises, He was handing Himself over to death. And yet, in the words of the Prophet Isaiah, He set His face “like flint” and was obedient to His mission of self-giving love. He knew that so many would abandon Him, and yet He chose at every moment to persist, all the way to Calvary. Jesus also knows that you and I fail. That we turn our backs on Him in ways little and small. And yet He continues to make His love available to us today, holding back nothing.

As we enter into Holy Week, let this be our focus: that no matter how many times we’ve failed this Lent, and no matter how often we turn away from Christ, His Love for us is as constant and pure as it was when He first took up the Cross. During these days leading up to Good Friday, let’s experience contrition for our sins, remorse for our mistakes, but also incredible gratitude for Christ’s saving Love. And let’s show our gratitude by picking up our Cross and following Him in the way of self-giving love. One way we can do so, as Lent comes to a close, is to consider supporting the Annual Diocesan Appeal as a final act of Lenten almsgiving.



**WELCOME!**

As we gather again for the celebration of Mass, we are all asked to do our part to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Out of an abundance of caution for others gathered, please be aware, prior to entering the church, an usher will ask you a series of questions. Please be patient and wait for their instructions regarding seating, as we must comply with social distancing guidelines.

We ask that everyone takes the following precautions:



Stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.



Maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in the church or on church property.



All those aged 10 and up and those to receive Communion must wear a face mask or face covering. Be sure the mask covers your nose and your mouth.



Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.



Sanitize hands when entering and leaving church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion, if possible.



Consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand. After receiving the host in your hand, step six feet to the side, lower your mask, consume the host, put your mask back in place and return to your seat.

If you have a fever or symptoms of COVID-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.

## Haiti Lenten Appeal 2021

Hello, my name is David Rabidoux and I'm on the board of directors for the Maison Fortune' Orphanage Foundation (MFOF). This Wednesday is Ash Wednesday and it is also the start of our Annual Haiti Lenten Appeal. For over 20 years, Prince of Peace (POP) has been supporting the 250 children at Maison Fortune' Orphanage (MFO).

While I am not able to speak in person this year, I wanted to share some great news about two of our children that recently graduated high school. Etienne Nazaire and François Pinchinat passed the entrance exam and were selected to attend the Veterinary Technician School. (See Picture Below) This program is being fully funded from one of our regular donors. In Haiti, Vet Techs are much like our licensed Veterinarian Technicians in US, but with a bit more responsibility as they are relied upon more than Veterinarians in many instances; mainly because Vet Techs travel by motorcycle to remote locations to care for agricultural animals. The end result is gainful employment for these two and they will pave the way for an ongoing cycle of MFO graduates to attend this sponsored program!

Last year our focus was on much needed maintenance for the Girls and Boys Campuses. Through your generosity we were able to raise a total of \$22,486.00 (\$21,135.50 for Haiti and POP for \$1,353.50.) Some of the money was used to have louvers installed on the windows to keep the children warm and dry. I am pleased to report that none of our children have contracted COVID due to campus restrictions put in place.

Work on the replacement well is on hold until we are clear of the pandemic. As the primary source of water on the campus, we wanted to keep any contamination to a minimum. The well was temporarily fixed and is functioning, but needs a complete overhaul. As soon as we can safely hire contractors from Port au Prince, work will resume.

Last fall, we were able to send 375 supply boxes to MFO with help from POP parishioners and the Knights of Columbus. This has helped augment the ongoing needs of the children. Thank you!

The Foundation has established an annual budget of \$450,000 and needs your help. Due to lack of in-person fundraising events (due to COVID) coupled with rising costs, the MFOF budget has reached the brink. Adding to the rising costs, the Haitian Gourde has recently gained strength against the American dollar. This fiscal year, our yearly donations are down 52% compared to last year. Our greatest need is continuing to serve the children on a daily basis.

Our goal this year is to raise \$32,500.00 to

- \$14,500 to cover the cost of spring 2021 tuition to educate our high schooler aged children in local parochial schools
- \$18,000 to cover operating costs for June to pay our primary school staff, our residential staff and administration, utility bills, food, housing, clothing and medical care.

Over the years you have given your resources to support the children of Maison Fortune. But most of all you have given these children "HOPE". These children now see and believe that they have a chance for a better life, a chance to make something of themselves, and maybe eventually to then give back to those less fortunate.

So, we are asking again for your generous support of the Annual Haiti Lenten Appeal.

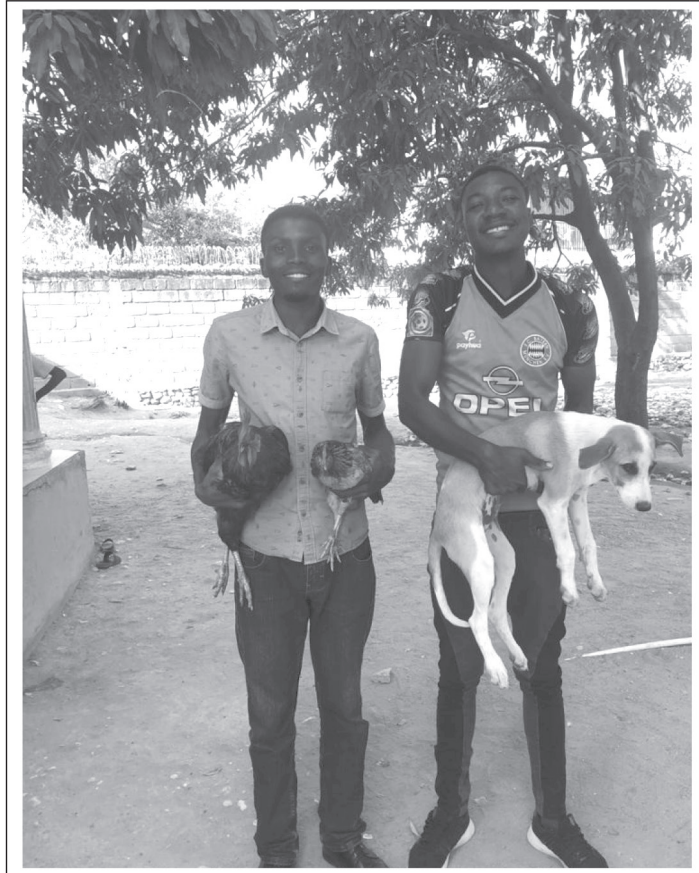

#### 6. **NEW SOCKS / NEW MEN'S T-SHIRTS (M, L, XL) / NEW MEN'S UNDERWEAR M, L, XL**

\*Must be new in package.

\*\*NOT ACCEPTING ANY OTHER CLOTHES ITEMS AT THIS TIME. \*\*

Can be dropped off in the donation boxes at Prince of Peace Catholic Church lobby during church office hours during week or before Masses on weekends.

#### 7. **"LOVE COOKIE" Program**

Bake a couple dozen of homemade cookies that can be frozen until we need them.

\*Must schedule a donation date and receive instructions.

\*\*We don't accept cookies that are dropped off without being scheduled.

#### 8. **"Welcome Home Bags Program"**

For people transitioning into permanent housing, a list of kitchen type items including shelf stable food – See list below.
