

Our mission is to strengthen our parish by bringing neighbors together. The following dates have been scheduled for events taking place here at Prince of Peace!




FOOD PANTRY: Donations for the food pantry can be made on Monday from 10:00-11:00 a.m. and on Wednesday from 10:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. Someone is near the pantry entrance to receive your donations. Financial gifts can be made by going to popparish. org and submitted through e-giving. You may not be present physically to give out the food but without your charity, we could not be your hands and heart. You are an integral part of this entire operation. We are doing a drive-through from 10:00 a.m.-12:00 p.m. on Wednesday for anyone who needs food.

Thank you very much to all parishioners who donated food for the monthly collection. We do between 55 or 65 bags for the people who come to the drive-through on Wednesday morning so all the food we receive is really appreciated. Next weekend, April 10/11 will be the monthly collection for the pantry. At this time, we do not need the following: canned vegetables, mac & cheese and canned fruit. We can use juice, cereal, pasta (1 lb.) & sauce (NO GLASS JARS), Hamburger Helper, soup (18 or 19 oz.) Jell-O, jelly, Ramen Noodles, boxed mashed potatoes, tuna (5 oz.), pork & beans (15 oz.) and peanut butter(15 oz.) Happy Easter and God Bless.

Let us give thanks that we are able to help those in need.

As a parishioner, if you need food, please come to the Food Pantry to pick up a bag of groceries too.




ANNUAL APPEAL:

What would have happened if Mary Magdalene (and, depending on which Gospel account you read, the other women) hadn't come to the tomb on that first Easter Sunday morning? WELCOME!

As we gather again for the celebration of Mass, we are all asked to do our part to prevent the spread of COVID-19. Out of an abundance of caution for others gathered, please

be aware, prior to entering the church, an usher will ask you a series of questions. Please be patient and wait for their instructions regarding seating, as we must comply with social distancing guidelines.

We ask that everyone takes the following precautions:



Stay home if you are ill, elderly, anxious, or immunocompromised. Bishop Knestout has dispensed all Catholics in the Diocese from their Sunday Mass obligation.



Maintain six feet of social distance from others who are not from the same household at all times while in the church or on church property.



All those aged 10 and up and those to receive Communion must wear a face mask or face covering. Be sure the mask covers your nose and your mouth.



Refrain from physical contact, such as holding hands during the Our Father and shaking hands during the Sign of Peace.



Sanitize hands when entering and leaving church. Bring personal supply of hand sanitizer to use before receiving Communion, if possible.



Consider receiving Holy Communion in the hand. After receiving the host in your hand, step six feet to the side, lower your mask, consume the host, put your mask back in place and return to your seat.

If you have a fever or symptoms of COVID-19, you will not be permitted to enter the building.

2. 20 pieces of SOFT FRUIT

Soft fruit includes oranges, bananas, bunches of grapes *MUST schedule a donation date and receive instructions.

**We don't accept fruit that is dropped off without being scheduled.

3. 4 cases of WATER BOTTLES

*MUST schedule a donation date and receive instructions.

**We don't accept water bottles that are dropped off without being scheduled.

4. SHELF STABLE FOOD ITEMS

List below.

*Can be dropped off in the donation boxes in church lobby during church office Hours during week or before Masses on weekends.

5. HYGIENE ITEMS

List below.

*Can be dropped off in the donation boxes in the Prince of Peace Catholic Church lobby during regular church office hours during the week or before Masses on weekends.

6. NEW SOCKS / NEW MEN'S T-SHIRTS (M, L, XL) / NEW MEN's UNDERWEAR M, L, XL

*Must be new in package.

**NOT ACCEPTING ANY OTHER CLOTHES ITEMS AT THIS TIME. **
Can be dropped off in the donation boxes at Prince of Peace Catholic Church lobby during church office hours during week or before Masses on weekends.

7. "LOVE COOKIE" Program

Bake a couple dozen of homemade cookies that can be frozen until we need them.

*Must schedule a donation date and receive instructions.

**We don't accept cookies that are dropped off without being scheduled.

8. "Welcome Home Bags Program"

For people transitioning into permanent housing, a list of kitchen type items including shelf stable food – See list below.

9. MONETARY DONATION: to the Prince of Peace Catholic Church Homeless Meals Ministry. Checks can be made out to Prince of Peace Catholic Church, in the memo section please write: Homeless Meals Ministry. Checks can be mailed to: Prince of Peace Catholic Church, 621 Cedar Rd, Chesapeake, VA 23322. Or you can make a donation online at: popparish.org and click the link to Parishsoft giving and offering. Please click on "choose fund" and select "Homeless Meals Ministry. You can also choose to be a recurring donor, if you would like.

10. **HOTEL FEEDING PROGRAM** - churches and other organizations can sign up for 1 night to a week of providing dinners. We have at any time about 50-60 people that we bring dinners for each night. Any place of business, civic group, HOA or other organizations can be a part if they can provide even 1 night's worth (60) of dinners.**MUST schedule a donation date and receive instructions.

**We will not accept dinners that are dropped off without being scheduled and given instructions.

Homelessness does not end when the CAST Season ends in the beginning of April.

Homelessness occurs YEAR-ROUND in our city.
