Synod

Pope Francis called for the World Synod of Bishops to take place in October 2023.

A synod is a gathering of bishops for specific kinds of issues. Synods are meant to be consultative, to be able to hear from those who are participating in the life of the Church. Pope Francis has asked that the Synod of Bishops in 2023 would be about synodality, or how we as disciples are journeying together to reflect on and respond to the Holy Spirit's call to us. The synod's theme is "communion, participation and mission." Pope Francis formally opened the synod process with a Mass at St. Peter's Basilica on October 10.

In his homily on October 10, Pope Francis told those gathered that a synod is "a journey of spiritual discernment that takes place in Adoration, in prayer and in dialogue with the word of God."

The faithful can reflect on how they encounter the Holy Spirit. Consider how you encounter others who are participating in the life of the Church. How are you journeying together with others to be in communion with the Lord? Prince of Peace parishioners are invited to participate in listening sessions. The sessions will take place both virtually and in person. To sign up for a session, please go to our parish website. For more information, please contact one of our parish Synod Coordinators Mary Riley or Sister Dolores whose information is on the front of our parish bulletin. And, of course, we can pray! "Here We Are, Holy Spirit" is a great prayer to invite the Holy Spirit into your heart for guidance on your journey.

CHRISTIAN FORMATION REGISTRATION:

LENT RESOURCES

From their website:

Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence: Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter.

Little Black Books are available in the Commons Area to assist you during your Lenten journey. The books provide content to spend 6 minutes a day with God. The plain cover allows anyone to comfortably use the book in public. The books have been updated, using the readings for this year.





FATHER ROMEO D. JAZMIN FOOD PANTRY:

This past year 2021, the food pantry served 3,198 (infants and children), along with 4,848 adults (18+) for a yearly grand total of 8,046 people served. The 2021 grand total figure (8,046) is an increase of 2,000 people over year 2020 and 4,000 people over year 2019.

The pantry started on October 10th, 2010 and to date through December 2021, the Parishioners have served a cumulative total of 49,011 infants, children, and adults.

KEEPING IT COOL CAMPAIGN: The AC/Heating system in the parish education wing is over 20 years old, and is in serious disrepair. The lack of adequate air conditioning and heat has impacted everything from Christian Formation for our youth and adults, to outreach ministries like the Food Pantry and Homeless Meals Program. As a result, many ministries have been relocated out of that space, and others have persevered in spite of the uncomfortable conditions.

The current system is outdated, complicated and expensive to maintain, and therefore must be replaced. After investigating options for a new system, the church has partnered with a longtime vendor to replace the old system with a modern alternative that will serve the church for the next 20 years. The cost of the new equipment and installation is \$181,000.00. The church has made a down payment and is working with the Richmond Diocese for a loan so that the project can proceed right away.

To cover the cost of the project and repay the loan, the church is launching the "Keeping It Cool" Campaign, which will run through May 31, 2022. It will rely on the generosity of the parish community to raise the necessary funds to make it successful. Please prayerfully consider contributing

toward this revenue goal.


