#### Synod

Pope Francis called for the World Synod of Bishops to take place in October 2023.

A synod is a gathering of bishops for specific kinds of issues. Synods are meant to be consultative, to be able to hear from those who are participating in the life of the Church. Pope Francis has asked that the Synod of Bishops in 2023 would be about synodality, or how we as disciples are journeying together to reflect on and respond to the Holy Spirit's call to us. The synod's theme is "communion, participation and mission." Pope Francis formally opened the synod process with a Mass at St. Peter's Basilica on October 10.

In his homily on October 10, Pope Francis told those gathered that a synod is "a journey of spiritual discernment that takes place in Adoration, in prayer and in dialogue with the word of God."

The faithful can reflect on how they encounter the Holy Spirit. Consider how you encounter others who are participating in the life of the Church. How are you journeying together with others to be in communion with the Lord? Prince of Peace parishioners are invited to participate in listening sessions. The sessions will take place both virtually and in person. To sign up for a session, please go to our parish website. #### **LENT RESOURCES**

From their website:

Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence: Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter.

#### ITINERARY

#### Day 1, July 4, Monday, DEPART USA

Departure from Washington Dulles Airport (IAD) with an overnight flight to Lisbon. Dinner and breakfast will be served on board.

#### Day 2, July 5, Tuesday, ARRIVAL in LISBON, SANTAREM, FATIMA, PORTUGAL

After arrival to Lisbon, continue to the town of Santarem for a short visit, one of the oldest cities in the world. We will visit the Church of St Stephen, containing the oldest recorded Eucharistic miracle. Behold the 750 years old Holy Miracle of Santarem, a relic of the Bleeding Host. We will drive to nearby Fatima, the location of the Blessed Mother who appeared in 1917 to three simple shepherd children and exhorted mankind to pray for world peace. In the evening, you may participate in the candlelight procession or relax. Dinner and overnight in Fatima.

Day 3, July 6, Wednesday, FATIMA, PORTUGAL

After breakfast, we will celebrate morning Mass and visit the Little Chapel of the Apparitions. We will tour Fatima and see the Basilica, site of Francesco and Jacinta's graves, the Hamlet of Aljustrel, where the children lived: and Valinhos, the site of Our Lady's appearance after the children's return from prison. We will then follow the Stations of the Cross along the Via Sacra (The Sacred Way). We will join pilgrims from around the world in an evening candlelight procession to pray the rosary. Dinner and overnight in Fatima.

#### Day 4, July 7, Thursday, FATIMA, BURGOS, CATHEDRAL of BURGOS

After breakfast, we will drive to **Burgos**, **Spain** which is situated in the Pilgrim's Road to **Santiago de Compostela**. After arrival we will visit the cathedral of Burgos, declared **World Heritage**. Dinner and overnight in Burgos.

#### Day 5, July 8, Friday, BURGOS, SPAIN to LOURDES, FRANCE

After breakfast, we will drive through the Pyrenees Mountains to Lourdes. Evening mass, dinner and overnight in Lourdes.

#### Day 6, July 9, Saturday, LOURDES, FRANCE

After breakfast we will celebrate morning Mass. Participate in **the walking tour of Lourdes** and the Way of the Cross. Lourdes is the birthplace of St. Bernadette to whom Our Lady appeared in 1858 near the Grotto of Massabielle. In the afternoon, enjoy time for **personal Devotions**, **drink Holy Water**. visit the **Miraculous Baths**. Participate in the **evening Candlelight Procession**. Dinner and overnight in Lourdes.

#### Day 7, July 10, Sunday, LOURDES, FRANCE to NICE, FRANCE

After morning Mass, we will drive to Nice area for dinner and overnight.

#### Day 8, July 11, Monday, NICE, FRANCE to ASSISI, ITALY

After breakfast, we will drive to **Assisi**, where **St Francis** tended the poor and sick and founded the Franciscan order. Dinner and overnight in Assisi **Day 9, July 12, Tuesday, ASSISI-ROME, ITALY** 

After breakfast we will celebrate Mass at **the Basilica of St Francis**. Explore the quaint hilltop birthplace of St Francis, which still retains an unspoiled quality similar to the early 1200's when he began his ministry. Visit the huge 13th-century Basilica containing many of St. Francis possessions and a series of frescoes depicting his life. You will see and kneel before the "talking Ccrucifix" from which Jesus spoke to St. Francis, asking him to rebuild His church. This was **St Mary of the Angels Basilica**, where St Francis spent most of his life. Here we visit the Chapel, **Portiuncola**, the rose bush, and the cave where the saint retired for prayer. After our visit in Assisi, we will continue our trip to Rome. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

#### Day 10, July 13, Wednesday, PAPAL AUDIENCE, VATICAN CITY

After breakfast we will depart for the Papal Audience (depending upon availability) in the monumental St. Peter's Square and see the Basilica of St. Peter in Vatican City. Afternoon free time in Vatican City. Dinner and overnight in Rome.

#### Day 11, July 14, Thursday, CHRISTIAN ROME, MAJOR BASILICAS, VATICAN CITY & ROME, ITALY

After breakfast we will drive and celebrate mass at **St Paul Outside the Walls**, which houses the **remains of St. Paul** under the main altar. Many relics are displayed, along with the chains that once bound the apostle while a prisoner in Rome. We will continue our touring through **Capitoline Hill, Roman Forum, Coliseum, and Arch of Constantine, Circus Maximus, Old Appian Way, and Palazzo Venezia.** We will visit the major Basilicas: **St Mary Major**, one of the oldest basilicas dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, after she appeared to Pope Liberius in 358 requesting a church be built in her honor. This shrine contains a **relic from the Manger where the Infant Jesus was laid**. **The Basilica of the St John in Lateran**, the former residence of all the popes prior to their return to Rome in 1377. Dinner and overnight in Rome

Day 12, July 15, Friday, ROME, PADRE PIO, After breakfast, we will drive to Giovanni Rotondo, Padre Pio's hometown. Visit Padre Pio's Tomb & cell at the old church where he received the Stigmata. We will visit Monte Sant'Angelo and the Grotto of St. Michael if time permits. Dinner at Padre Pio. After dinner we will return to Rome airport for our flight on next day.

Day 13, Jul 16, Saturday, DEPART ROME for USA, Take an early morning flight at 6:05 AM to USA.

This past year 2021, the food pantry served 3,198 (infants and children), along with 4,848 adults (18+) for a yearly grand total of 8,046 people served. The 2021 grand total figure (8,046) is an increase of 2,000 people over year 2020 and 4,000 people over year 2019.

The pantry started on October 10th, 2010 and to date through December 2021, the Parishioners have served a cumulative total of **49,011** infants, children, and adults.

#### Annual Easter "Ham It Up Campaign "



KEEPING IT COOL CAMPAIGN: Keeping It Cool Campaign update: As of February 28, 2022, we have raised \$26,138.00. Thank you for your continued support. The AC/Heating system in the parish education wing is over 20 years old, and is in serious disrepair. The lack of adequate air conditioning and heat has impacted everything from Christian Formation for our youth and adults, to outreach ministries like the Food Pantry and Homeless Meals Program. As a result, many ministries have been relocated out of that space, and others have persevered in spite of the uncomfortable conditions.

The current system is outdated, and complicated and expensive to maintain, and therefore must be replaced. After investigating options for a new system, the church has partnered with a long-time vendor to replace the old system with a modern alternative that will serve the church for the next 20 years. The cost of the new equipment and installation is \$181,000.00. The church has made a down payment and is working with the Richmond Diocese for a loan so that the project can proceed right away.

To cover the cost of the project and repay the loan, the church is launching the "Keeping It Cool" Campaign, which will run through May 31, 2022. It will rely on the generosity of the parish community to raise the necessary funds to make it successful. Please prayerfully consider contributing toward this revenue goal.

It is important to complete this system upgrade so that the programs, missions and outreach ministries that have defined the Prince of Peace community may continue and grow as we worship and serve together. May God bless you.

**DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL:** It can be easy to read today's Gospel primarily as an account of Jesus saying "no." No to the devil's temptations of earthly comfort, no to idols of power and glory, and no to arrogantly manipulating God's will.



But this Gospel passage is as much about what Jesus is saying "yes" to as it is what He's saying "no" to. Each denial of the devil is really a profound affirmation of Christ's identity as the Son of God. Jesus rejects these temptations, not because things like bread or even ruling are bad, but because they're being offered to Him on the condition that He turns away from God the Father. In fact, Jesus's relationship with the Father is the source of His resistance to the devil's temptations. He isn't "going it alone." Instead, He's relying upon the strength of the Father to carry Him through. It's relationship, not isolated "willpower," that is the source of His strength.

This is such an important lesson for us as we begin our Lenten season. Lenten disciplines are not about proving our "spiritual toughness." They're about abandoning ourselves more fully to the Father, so that we might not "live on bread alone." One way we do this during Lent is through the practice of almsgiving – giving to the poor or to some other worthy cause. One cause our parish is striving to support is the Annual Diocesan Appeal. At the beginning of this Lenten season, let's embrace almsgiving as an opportunity to say "yes" to the Father and our relationship with Him.


