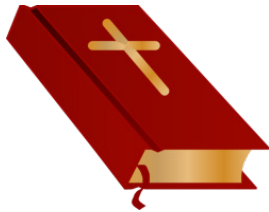

Synod

Pope Francis called for the World Synod of Bishops to take place in October 2023.

A Synod is a gathering of bishops for specific kinds of issues. Synods are meant to be consultative, to be able to hear from those who are participating in the life of the Church. Pope Francis has asked that the Synod of Bishops in 2023 would be about synodality, or how we as disciples are journeying together to reflect on and respond to the Holy Spirit's call to us. The Synod's theme is "communion, participation and mission." Pope Francis formally opened the Synod process with a Mass at St. Peter's Basilica on October 10.

In his homily on October 10, Pope Francis told those gathered that a Synod is "a journey of spiritual discernment that takes place in Adoration, in prayer and in dialogue with the word of God."

The faithful can reflect on how they encounter the Holy Spirit. Consider how you encounter others who are participating in the life of the Church. How are you journeying together with others to be in communion with the Lord? Prince of Peace parishioners are invited to participate in listening sessions. The sessions will take place both virtually and in person. To sign up for a session, please go to our parish website. LENT RESOURCES

From their website:

Regulations for Fasting and Abstinence: Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all, 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence.

All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence.

Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter.

KEEPING IT COOL CAMPAIGN:

Keeping It Cool Campaign update: As of March 7, 2022, we have raised \$30,373. Thank you for your generosity.

The AC/Heating system in the parish education wing is over 20 years old, and is in serious disrepair. The lack of adequate air conditioning and heat has impacted everything from Christian Formation for our youth and adults, to outreach ministries like the Food Pantry and Homeless Meals Program. As a result, many ministries have been relocated out of that space, and others have persevered in spite of the uncomfortable conditions.

The current system is outdated, and complicated and expensive to maintain, and therefore must be replaced. After investigating options for a new system, the church has partnered with a long-time vendor to replace the old system with a modern alternative that will serve the church for the next 20 years. The cost of the new equipment and installation is \$181,000.00. The church has made a down payment and is working with the Richmond Diocese for a loan so that the project can proceed right away.

To cover the cost of the project and repay the loan, the church is launching the "Keeping It Cool" Campaign, which will run through May 31, 2022. It will rely on the generosity of the parish community to raise the necessary funds to make it successful. Please prayerfully consider contributing toward this revenue goal.

It is important to complete this system upgrade so that the programs, missions and outreach ministries that have defined the Prince of Peace community may continue and grow as we worship and serve together. May God bless you.

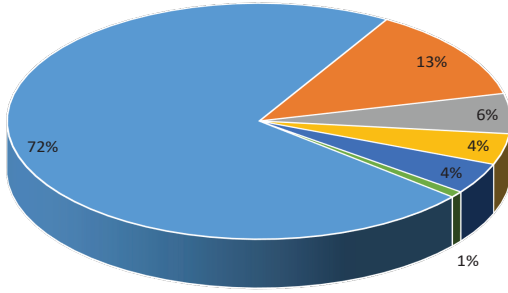

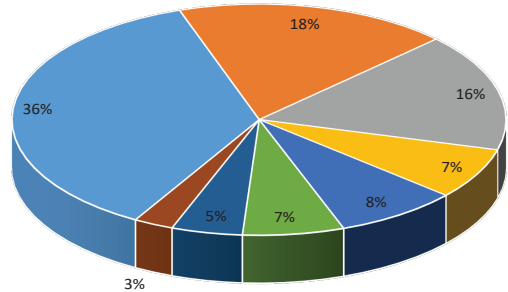

DIOCESAN ANNUAL APPEAL:

The Transfiguration reveals Jesus as the Son of God – but this isn't for Jesus' sake. He already knows His identity. Instead, the Transfiguration is a gift for His apostles. Just before the Lord's entry into Jerusalem, where He will suffer His Passion and death, He gives Peter, John, and James a glimpse of His glory and the truth of who He is. It is this experience of His glory and the conviction that He is the Son of God that will sustain these apostles at their darkest hour – in John's case, at the foot of the Cross, and for Peter, in the aftermath of his denial of Christ.

The Transfiguration is a gift for us as well. We're on our own journey with Jesus towards Jerusalem, as we move into the second week of Lent. Jesus reminds us of His glory, and His power over death, just as the going can get a little tough for us – when the Lenten practices and penances we committed to so eagerly just over a week ago can begin to feel like burdens. By revealing His power and glory, Jesus shows us that He isn't a prize we'll receive on the other side of Easter, but He's a presence that will be with us throughout the journey – including in our Lenten "darkest hours!" One practice we're emphasizing as a parish this Lent is almsgiving – especially giving to our Annual Diocesan Appeal. The Transfiguration helps us see that when we pick up our cross through our giving – especially when it involves some sacrifice on our part – we are not alone. We're with Jesus, the Lord of Life. Let's meditate upon the Transfiguration and see how we might be moved to give in light of the truth of who Jesus is and His closeness to us.

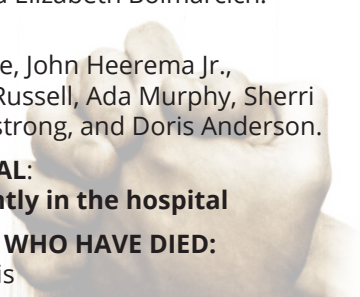

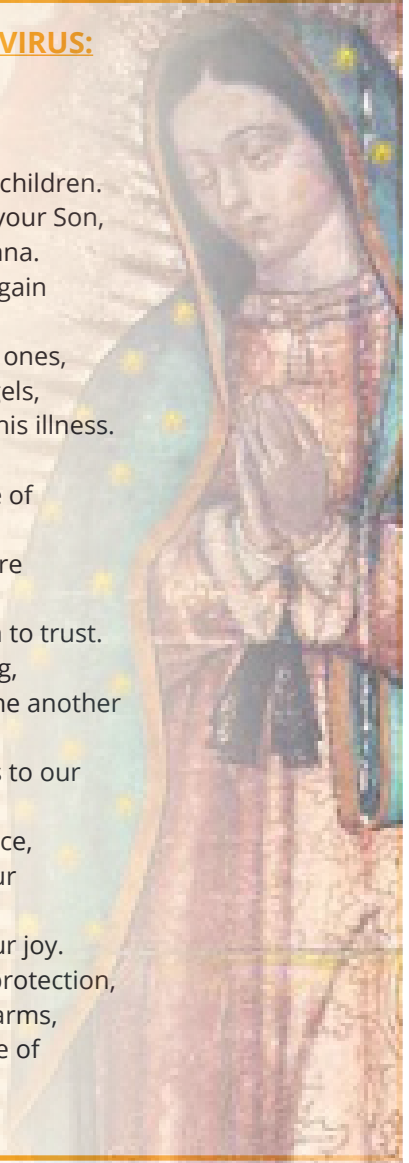
