2023 ANNUAL APPEAL: Once again this year, Prince of Peace is participating in the Annual Diocesan Appeal. The Appeal is a yearly opportunity to

support the next generation, provide for those in need and build up our Catholic communities. RECONCILIATION TIME CHANGE DURING

LENT: In order to provide opportunity for those wishing Confession during Lent, Father John Bosco will begin hearing Confessions at 3:30 p.m. on Saturday during Lent. This change is effective immediately until April 1, 2023.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS: Father John Bosco will lead the Stations of the Cross immediately following our 9:00 a.m. Daily Mass on Fridays during Lent. (Except First Friday). The Rosary will continue to be prayed after the 9:00 a.m. Daily Masses Tuesdays-Thursdays. **REGULATIONS FOR FASTING AND ABSTINENCE:** Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed. Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or Renewal of Baptism at Easter.
