# ALTAR SERVER MINISTRY



\*Middle School and High School Youth Ministry and Peer Ministry for the Fall 2023-2024 school year is on Sunday evenings twice a month, 6:00-8:00 p.m.

\*Friday Family Faith began for the Fall 2023-2024 school year on Friday, September 29th. In Family Faith, families get together once a month to share a meal and formational experience. The remaining three lessons are completed at home and turned in the following month. Monthly meetings run from 6:30-8:30 p.m. Parents should register younger children using the elementary K-5th grade link and older children using the youth 6th-12th grade link. (See below.)

# ADVENT

From the website of the United States Catholic Bishops:

**ADVENT:** Advent (*ad-venio* in Latin or "to come to") begins the Church year and consists of the four Sundays before Christmas. The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to Christ's second coming at the end of time and also to the anniversary of the Lord's birth on Christmas. Advent devotions remind us of the meaning of the season. Special Advent Devotions: The lighting of the Advent wreath each Sunday during Advent. Advent prayers prepare us spiritually for the birth of Jesus Christ.

**ADVENT WREATH:** The four candles represent the four weeks of Advent. Three candles are purple and one is rose. The purple candles in particular symbolize the prayer, penance, and preparatory sacrifices and goods works undertaken at this time. The rose candle is lit on the third Sunday, Gaudete Sunday, when the priest also wears rose vestments at Mass; Gaudete Sunday is the Sunday of rejoicing, because the faithful have arrived at the midpoint of Advent, when their preparation is now half over and they are close to Christmas. The progressive lighting of the candles symbolizes the expectation and hope surrounding our Lord's first coming into the world and the anticipation of His second coming to judge the living and the dead.

**ADVENT PRAYERS:** Advent prayers call to mind our preparation for the Lord's coming on Christmas and His second coming at the end of the world. The Advent theme of preparing one spiritually requires special Advent prayers focused on waiting, watching, and hoping for the Lord's coming. Many Advent prayer books include daily prayers, while others involve the writings of popular Catholics including Pope John Paul II or Fulton Sheen. Other prayers are meant specifically to be said along with an Advent wreath.

# PRAYER OF BLESSING FOR YOUR HOME ADVENT WREATH:

Lord, our God, we praise You for Your Son, Jesus Christ: He is Emmanuel, the hope of all people, He is the wisdom that teaches and guides us, He is the Savior of every nation. Lord God, let Your blessing come upon us as we light the candles of this Advent wreath. May the wreath and its light be a sign of Christ's promise to bring us salvation. We ask this through Christ, our Lord. Amen.

Alternate/Complementary Prayer: O Emmanuel, Jesus Christ, desire of every nation, Savior of all peoples, come and dwell among us. (From Christmas Prayers, Victor Hoagland, C.P.)

Scriptures: Isaiah 11:1-10, Isaiah 7:10-14, Luke: 1:26-38, Matthew 1:18-24

**Second Week of Advent:** Light 2 purple candles.

**Prayer:** Stir up our hearts, O Lord, to prepare the paths of Your onlybegotten Son: that we may worthily serve You with hearts purified by His coming: Who lives and reigns with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

**Alternate/Complementary Prayer:** O King of all nations, Jesus Christ, only joy of every heart, come and save Your people.

(From Christmas Prayers, Victor Hoagland, C.P.) Scriptures: Micah 5:2, Isaiah 2:1-5, Matthew 2:1-2, 9-11, Matthew 3:1-6

Third Week of Advent: Light 2 purple candles and the rose candle.

**Prayer:** We beseech You to listen to our prayers, O Lord, and by the grace of Your coming enlighten our darkened minds: You who lives and reigns with God the Father in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God forever and ever. Amen.

**Alternate/Complementary Prayer:** O Key of David, Jesus Christ, the gates of heaven open at Your command, come and show us the way to salvation.

(From Christmas Prayers, Victor Hoagland, C.P.) Scriptures: Isaiah 9:6-7, Ecclesiastes 3:1-8, John 1:19-34, Philippians 2:1-11

**Fourth Week of Advent:** Light 3 purple candles and the rose candle.

**Prayer:** Pour forth Your power, O Lord, and come: Assist us by that mighty power, so that by Your grace and merciful kindness we may swiftly receive the salvation that our sins impede: Who lives and reigns with Thee in the unity of the Holy Spirit, ever one God, world without end. Amen.

**Alternate/Complementary Prayer:** O Wisdom, holy Word of God, Jesus Christ, all things are in Your hands, come and show us the way to salvation.

(From Christmas Prayers, Victor Hoagland, C.P.) Scriptures: Malachi 3:1-5, Romans 8:18-25, Isaiah 52:7-10, Revelation 21:1-4

**(Optional) Christmas Eve/Christmas Day:** Light 3 purple candles and the rose candle. Light a white candle placed in the center.

**Prayer:** God of love, Father of all, the darkness that covered the earth has given way to the bright dawn of Your Word made flesh. Make us a people of this light. Make us faithful to Your Word that we may bring Your life to the waiting world. Grant this through Christ our Lord. Amen.


