"There is one among you whom you do not recognize, the one who is coming after me." – John 1:26-27

ANNUAL DIOCESAN APPEAL

John warned the crowds, "There is one among you whom you do not recognize." (John 1:26) When Christ comes again, will we recognize Him?




PANTRY NEWS:




Some people of Jerusalem sent priests and Levites to question John the Baptist while he was baptizing at Bethany, on the other side of the Jordan River.
