PRAYER TO ST. MICHAEL

As we pray for peace and an end to violence throughout the world, we as a parish community will pray the Prayer to St. Michael after Mass. The prayer will be prayed after the Final Blessing and before the Recessional.

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle, be our protection against the wickedness and snares of the devil. May God rebuke him we humbly pray; and do thou, O Prince of the Heavenly host, by the power of God, cast into hell Satan and all the evil spirits who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

LENT REGULATIONS FOR FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Fasting is to be observed by all 18 years of age and older, who have not yet celebrated their 59th birthday. On a fast day, one full meal is allowed. Two other meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and juices, are allowed.

Abstinence is observed by all 14 years of age and older. On days of abstinence, no meat is allowed. Note that when health or ability to work would be seriously affected, the law does not oblige. When in doubt concerning fast and abstinence, the parish priest should be consulted.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. All the Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. Fasting, almsgiving, and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent. The faithful and catechumens should undertake these practices seriously in a spirit of penance and of preparation for Baptism or of renewal of Baptism at Easter.

Continue to Czestochowa, site of Poland's greatest pilgrimage shrine, Our Lady of Czestochowa, known as the Shrine of the Black Madonna. We celebrate mass at the Pauline Monastery and venerate the priceless treasures contained within, including the miraculous Icon. Then we proceed to Krakow. Dinner and overnight in Krakow.

Day 5, October 4, Friday, KRAKOW, DIVINE MERCY

After breakfast, we will have a city tour of Krakow, which includes a visit to the old town to see Cloth Hall, the Basilica of the Blessed Virgin Mary and the famous castle. Afternoon, we will go to the convent of the Sisters of Our Lady of Mercy, where St. Faustina lived and is buried. We will take part in the devotion to the Divine Mercy at the chapel of the Sister of Our Lady of Mercy in Lagiewniki and celebrate mass there. Dinner and overnight in Krakow.

Day 6, October 5, Saturday, KRAKOW, WIELICZKA

After breakfast, we will celebrate mass at the Our Lady of Mercy Shrine. Afternoon we will the Wieliczka salt mine which is listed on UNESCO's First List of World Cultural and Heritage and see the chambers that were functioned as chapels for the miners. Dinner & overnight in Krakow.

Day 7, October 6, Sunday, KRAKOW, PRAGUE

After breakfast we will leave for the enchanting city of Prague. A city of doomed rooftops, soaring steeples, and countless spires. Dinner and overnight in Prague. Day 8, October 7, Monday, PRAGUE

After breakfast, we begin our tour of beautiful Prague. Visit Prague Castle district where we see St. Vitus Cathedral, St. George Basilica, Loreto Church, and Strahov Monastery. We will celebrate Mass at the Church of Our Lady of Victorious, seeing there the celebrated statue of the Infant Jesus

After mass, we will walk through medieval Charles Bridge adorned with many baroque statues. See the Astronomical Clock, and Wenceslas Square. Dinner and overnight in Prague.

Day 9, October 8, Tuesday, PRAGUE, VIENNA

After breakfast, we leave for Vienna and visit St. Stephen's Cathedral which is an imposing structure dating to the 13th century. We'll have time at Stephansplatz for lunch and a chance to have Viennese pastry and coffee before seeing the State Opera House, home to the Vienna Boys Choir. Then we will take a walking tour to see the Historic Center of Vienna, and then proceed to take a view outside the Belvedere Palace. Dinner and overnight in Vienna.

Day 10, October 9, Wednesday, VIENNA, BUDAPEST

After breakfast we will celebrate mass in a local church and then visit Schonbrunn Palace. This sprawling, royal summer house contains 1, 441 rooms including the Hall of Mirrors where Mozart performed at the age of 6 before a young Marie Antoinette. We will have lunch and free time for shopping at Parndorf Designer Outlet. Continue to Budapest for dinner and overnight.

Day 11, October 10, Thursday, BUDAPEST

After breakfast, we will have a full day tour of Budapest. First, visit Buda, located at the right bank of the Danube River where Royal Castle is located. Enjoy view of the Parliament, Heroes' Square, Church of St. Stephan and the old town and Market. Then proceed to Pest, located on the hill on the other side of Danube River and visit Matthias Church where we celebrate mass. Continue to visit Gellert Hill and Citadel. Dinner and overnight in Budapest. Day 12, October 11, Friday, BUDAPEST, MARIJA BISTRICA, ZAGREB

Depart Budapest in the morning and drive to Zagreb, the capital of Croatia. On the way we stop to visit the most popular and oldest Croatian Marian Shrine - Marija Bistrica. Celebrate mass at the Marija Bistrica (subject to confirmation). Dinner and overnight in Zagreb.
