



LUMEN CHRISTI LEGACY SOCIETY

July is an Ordinary Time in our church calendar, BUT not at all an ordinary time. It is packed with memorable celebrations, divine interventions and commemoration of holy saints. On July 3, we celebrate St. Thomas the Apostle, who had doubts about the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, and when upon seeing and touching the wounds of Christ exclaimed, "My Lord and my God!" We honor St. Mary Magdalene on July 22, who showed her love for Christ looking for Him in the garden with anguish. She eyewitnessed the Risen Christ and announced and testified before the apostles His Resurrection, and she became an evangelist announcing the message of His Resurrection to all. St. James the Apostle, the first apostle to shed his blood for Christ in A.D. 44 (Acts 12:2) in Jerusalem, was beheaded by order of King Herod Agrippa I of Judaea. According to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, where his shrine attracts Christian pilgrims from all over the world. His martyrdom won him the title of "Saint James the Greater," by which we distinguish him from the other apostle. His feast day is July 25. Let's contemplate the life stories of these Saints, their love of Jesus and their unity with our church. This will bring a greater focus on God rather than ourselves.
