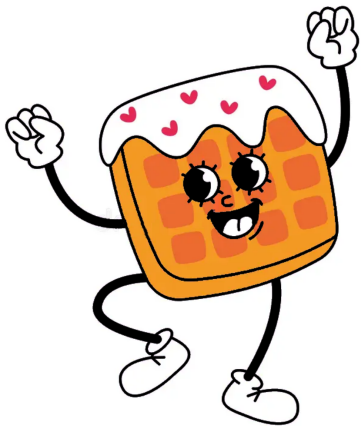

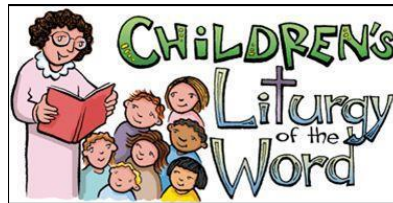

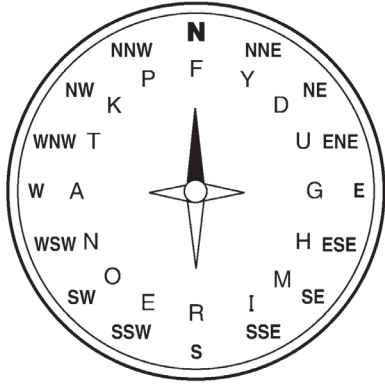
VIRTUS:

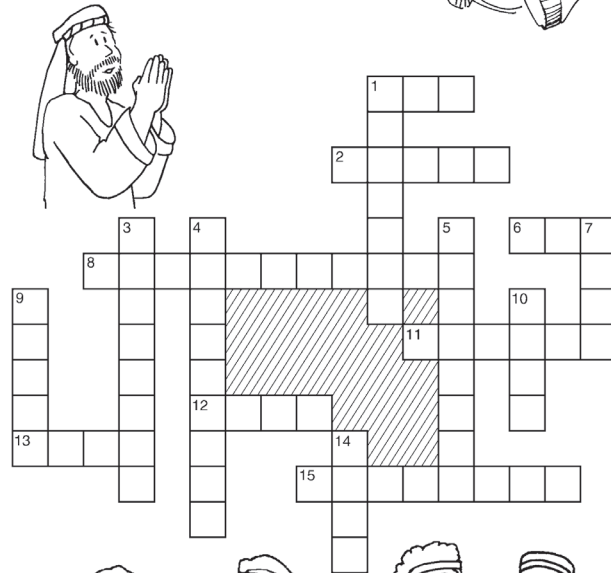



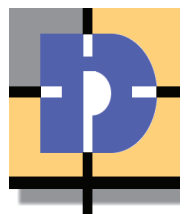
