Prince of Peace Catholic Church is Housing the Homeless with **CHESAPEAKE AREA SHELTER TEAM (CAST)**

WHO IS IT? CAST is a Chesapeake organization led by Sam Howard of Great Bridge Presbyterian

Church and is supported by Chesapeake area churches. **WHAT IS IT?** A confederation of area churches, synagogues, and other organizations that provide food, shelter and safety for the homeless in Chesapeake every winter.

WHERE IS IT? CAST embraces the needs of the homeless in Chesapeake where there exists a significant homeless population. CAST supports one sponsor site each week starting with dinner on every Wednesday (late December through mid-April) and concluding after breakfast the following Wednesday. In the past, each church hosting the homeless did so in their own facilities. This year, for the first time, we will be using a City of Chesapeake facility located at 2255 Steppingstone Square (off of Military Highway) to house and feed our guests, which will potentially include children.

HOW CAN I HELP? Be part of Prince of Peace's efforts in supporting the homeless this year by signing up for any one of several jobs the week we will host these special guests at Steppingstone Square, from April 2 through the morning of April 9, 2025. Signups will start in early March; details to be provided shortly. We have been housing the homeless every year (except for 2021 and 2022 due to Covid) since 1995 supporting our most needy in our community. Please consider helping in any way that you can. 



Serving Homeless in Chesapeake: -Newborns to Senior Citizens -Young Adults who have aged out of foster

Over 800 hygiene packs and more single hygiene items distributed to the Resource Cente

OUNTLESS clothing items: to people living in their vehicles, at encampments, and at the resource center. Keeping people clothed for whatever the current weather conditions are.

<u>-+50 pairs of sneakers</u> were donated, sanitized, scrubbed, washed, rinsed, and dried then donated to the resource center (+75 pairs from last year's total of 125 pairs from the beginning of the R2E program)

- Instructed 26 art classes this year. +18 last year = 44 art classes from the beginning of this program. (program helps people find a positive outlet to get away from their anxieties for a little bit.)

·Over 31,000 lbs -canned and boxed food Agape Feast helped distribute to people in need in Chesapeake through 7 local food pantries that we help keep stocked.




