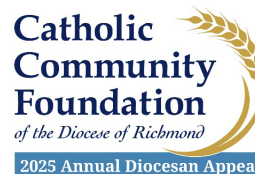

PASTOR'S EASTER GREETINGS 2025!

Dear friends,

We are so glad to have this opportunity to celebrate this Easter while in this Jubilee Year of Hope with a theme: "Pilgrims of Hope." It is true that Christ's Resurrection gives us hope that there is Resurrection. At the same time, we are so glad that our Parish Prince of Peace is also celebrating 50 years since its inception. What a Joy! "Christ is Risen! He is Risen as He said, Alleluia!" This ancient greeting sums up what we celebrate this Easter Sunday, the joy of Christ Risen and alive in our midst.

"This is the day the Lord has made: let us rejoice and be glad" (Psalm 118). This then is the Joyful Good News: Christ by His death and Resurrection has conquered sin so we may live. The Resurrection is the foundation and cornerstone of our faith.

St. Paul says, "If there is no Resurrection of the dead, then Christ cannot be raised either, and if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is useless and our faith too is in vain. (Cf. 1 Cor 15:13 -14). On Easter Vigil, we recall God's story – in our story of salvation. The liturgy of the Word re-enacts that story and we joyfully celebrate the Risen Lord in our midst as He offers Himself anew in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. We do this in a spirit of thanksgiving to God who gave us His own Son to die in order to rescue us from the slavery of sin.

May our encounter with the Risen Lord on our journey of faith touch us deeply and transform us as He did for His Disciples. May the Resurrection lead us to be the best version of ourselves; committed to live out our Baptismal covenant. When we live the new life of the Resurrection, we become the best versions of ourselves. We become what St. Augustine referred to as an "Easter People," a people transformed into disciples and stewards who commit to give their time, talent and treasure in witness.

My prayer for you this Easter is that you live as people deeply touched by the Resurrection and proclaim: Christ is Risen, Alleluia, Alleluia!

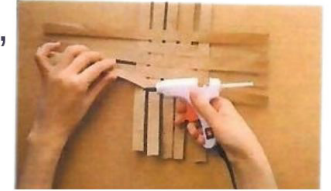

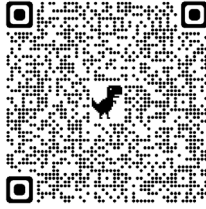

Agape Feast is an ecumenical homeless outreach ministry at Prince of Peace. The ministry is in dire need of shelf-stable food donation items, like fruit cups, chicken, cracker packs, individual serving size raisin packs, and more. We distribute and serve about 160 meals a week to people who are living on the streets, in their vehicles, or in encampments. THANK YOU, TIGERS!

This past year, a number of PoP parishioners stepped forward to help with the Refresh of the church for our 50th Anniversary Celebration. Significant among their many accomplishments were the preparation and painting of the Parish Hall, Atrium, and Commons. In addition, Tigers completely refurbished the three outside garden pathways, removed hedges, planted new flowers, mulched, relocated the garden statue of Our Blessed Lady to inside the garden walls, built and placed a lighted trellis over Mary, and installed a new garden statue of St. Joseph.

As a result, our Tiger teams saved in labor costs for our church well over an estimated \$100,000.00. But, the work continues! This summer, the Tigers will be putting up new Stations of the Cross inside the church, and relocating the old Stations to the outside garden pathways. The Tigers will also be planting more flowers in the garden and clearing away dead trees and brush from around our perimeter. As always, many hands make light work. 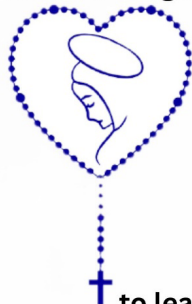

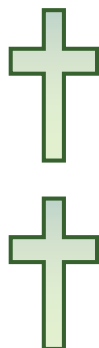
