Deacon Keith Fournier, BA, JD, MTS, MPhil. has been appointed by His Excellency, Bishop Barry Knestout, as Deacon to our parish. He has served as a Deacon of the Diocese of Richmond for almost 30 years. He is a Constitutional Lawyer and Moral Theologian. He and his beloved wife Laurine will soon celebrate their 50th anniversary. They have five grown children and eight grandchildren. Deacon Keith served for many years before his ordination as a lay leader. Deacon is a graduate of Franciscan University of Steubenville, the University of Pittsburgh Law School, the John Paul II Institute and the Catholic University of America. Deacon Keith and his wife Laurine recently moved back to Chesapeake Va. From Tyler, Texas.

A "revert" to the Catholic Church over fifty-two years ago, the deacon is a faithful Catholic Christian with an authentically ecumenical heart for the entire Christian community. He has spent his life as a "missionary to the culture" in varying roles of service – as counsel and a Dean to the Franciscan University of Steubenville in the 80s, first Executive Director of the American Center for Law and Justice in the Nineties, founder and President of Common Good Foundation, Editor in Chief of Catholic Online, Dean of Catholic Online School. He and his wife relocated to Tyler, Texas to assist Bishop Joseph Strickland in several capacities: as legal and theological advisor, Director of Deacon Formation and Dean of Catholic Identity for the School.

Deacon Fournier holds three theology degrees. His BA in Theology and Philosophy from the Franciscan University of Steubenville, his first master's degree from the John Paul II Institute of the Lateran University (emphasis on Marriage and family) and his MPhil in Moral Theology from the Catholic University of America. He completed all requirements for the PhD, but did not complete the Dissertation. His dissertation, which he still hopes to complete, is on the Theological Anthropology of the Gift in Pope St. John Paul II.

He holds his Juris Doctor Degree (JD) from the University of Pittsburgh School of Law and, in his legal practice, appeared as Co-Counsel in several Pro-Life, Pro-Family and Religious Liberty cases at the US Supreme Court. A published author of eight books and hundreds of articles, he now serves as special counsel and advisor to several ministries. Deacon Keith wants us all to know "...I am so very happy to be able to assist Fr. John Bosco and I am excited to serve the faithful of the Prince of Peace Catholic Church community."

July is an Ordinary Time in our Church calendar, BUT not at all an ordinary time. There are several celebrations, divine interventions and commemoration of holy saints. On **July 3**, we celebrate St. Thomas the Apostle who had doubts about the Resurrection of Jesus Christ, when upon seeing and touching the wounds of Christ exclaimed, "My Lord and my God!" We honor St. Mary Magdalene on **July 22**, who showed her love for Christ looking for Him in the garden with anguish. She eyewitnessed the Risen Christ and announced and testified before The Apostles His Resurrection, and she became an evangelist, announcing the message of His Resurrection to all. St. James the Apostle, the first apostle to shed his blood for Christ in A.D. 44 (Acts 12:2) in Jerusalem, was beheaded by order of King Herod Agrippa I of Judaea. According to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, where his shrine attracts Christian pilgrims from all over the world. His martyrdom won him the title of "Saint James the Greater" by which we distinguish him from the other apostle. His feast day is **July 25**. Let's contemplate the life stories of these Saints, their love of Jesus and their unity with our Church. They will remind us of the essential act of Catholic stewardship.
